Due Date	Your bill is due and payable by the date due on the bill. A 1% late payment charge will be Applied to any unpaid balance after the due date. \$35.00 NSF Charge.	
Meter Read Code	CE – Computer Estimate RR - Meter Re-Read	MR - Meter Read ME - Manual Estimate
Estimated Readings	When a meter is unable to be read, an estimated reading is used based on previous usage. Adjustments if necessary are made on the next billing when the meter is read.	
Demand	Demand is the peak rate which electric energy is used for any period of 15 consecutive minutes.	
Power Cost Adjustment	The adjustment reflects the variance in the cost of purchased power from the amount included for these costs in our basic electric rate.	
Meter Multiplier	On some types of meters, a multiplier is used to convert the meter readings to your total energy use.	
kWh	Kilowatt-Hour. This is the unit of measure of your electric use. One 100 watt light burning for 10 hours will consume 1 kWh.	
Customer Charge	The monthly charge covers the cost to maintain our meters, pipes, and lines.

Water Rates to Increase

Effective March 1, 2018, all water rates will increase by 3.0%. The Public Service Commission of Wisconsin (PSCW) approved the request for the adjustment filed by New Holstein Utilities. No other utility rate adjustments are planned for 2018.

Residential and small commercial accounts with a service size less than 1" will see their monthly customer charge increase by \$.26 and the volume charge will increase \$.11/1,000 gallons used. The public fire protection charge will rise \$.43/month for these same accounts. The new rates for all customer accounts are listed on the other side of this newsletter.

Several factors are contributors towards the need for the adjustment. One factor is that the utility's operating costs continue to rise. Another important factor is that technologies continue to make improvements which reduce the products use of water (i.e. low-flow showerheads and sink aerators, low-flush toilets and front load washing machines). Lifestyles have changed, including the fact that consumers are drinking more bottled water.

For the past four years, and eight out of the last nine years, New Holstein Utilities' customers have used less water. In fact, since 2008, the city's water consumption has decreased by 43%. At that pace, the water rate adjustments are barely keeping up to cover the reduction in the usage!

Calumet County to Implement Sales and Use Tax

The Calumet County Board of Supervisors has approved a plan to implement a 0.5% sales and use tax. The new tax will begin on April 1, 2018. Calumet County becomes the 66th Wisconsin county (out of 72) to impose the sales and use tax.

New Holstein Utilities will be adding this tax to the customers' utility bill and will see the tax added for the first time when they receive their bill in May. For every \$100 billed to an NHU customer, \$.50 will be added.

The county sales tax rate of 0.5% is imposed on retailers making taxable retail sales, licenses, leases or rentals or providing taxable services in a Wisconsin county that has adopted the county tax. The county use tax rate of 0.5% is imposed on purchasers of items used, stored, or consumed in counties that impose county tax.
